- Empirical research article published or under review in a peer-reviewed journal or empirical research presentation (with data) accepted at a peer-reviewed conference (peer-reviewed abstracts will not be considered)
- Is related to the Canadian education system
- You are one of the contributing authors of the original article/presentation

Submission Guidelines

- Written in plain language
- Entitled with a question that is answered by the research findings of article
- Approximately 100-125 words, divided across the following questions:
 - Why is this (topic/issue) important?
 - What did the article uncover?
 - Why does this matter?
