

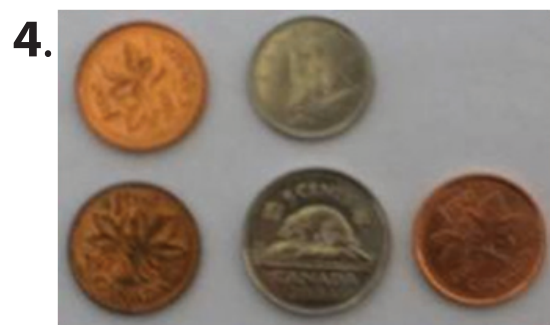
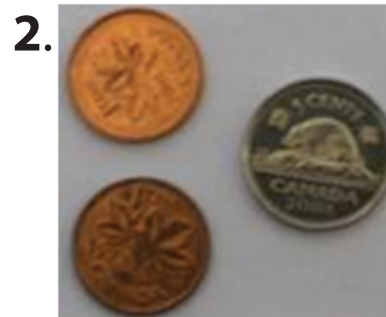
# Money Math

## Activity 1 - Canadian Coins

The Canadian dollar is the type of currency used in Canada. The dollar sign (\$) is used to indicate its value. One Canadian dollar is divided into 100 cents. The symbol used to indicate a portion of one dollar is the cent symbol (¢).

Currently there are 6 coins in circulation in Canada. They are the penny (worth 1¢), nickel (worth 5¢), dime (worth 10¢), quarter (worth 25¢), loonie (worth \$1) and toonie (worth \$2). There are also 6 bills: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100 and \$1,000.

**Activity Instructions:** Find the total value of the coins in each of the following images. Try starting with the coin with the greatest value. Remember to use your skip counting skills!
